The big lie: The total cost of the project will be covered by tax credits and rebates, and you need to act now. Find a solar panel installer today! Whether it's door-to-door or online, a forceful salesperson might inform you that a certain deal, like a financing rate or an incentive program, will only remain available. While reputable companies can help you save money with clean or solar energy improvements, scammers offer more than they can deliver. The scams vary, but here's the gist: someone claiming to be with the government or your utility company promises big savings on your utility bills from solar energy. Here's our guide to spotting solar panel scams and finding a great installer. Promises of “free solar panels” or talk of “special programs” and offers that end on a very tight time frame are warning. In many cases, they're part of a coordinated scam to steal your information, pressure you into signing a bad contract, or access your bank account. In 2024, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) logged over 1.3 million robocall scam complaints, with solar “offers” consistently. While the best solar panels can offer significant benefits, including reduced energy costs and a smaller carbon footprint, the growing industry has unfortunately attracted its share of scammers and unethical companies. 


